

OIL PAINTING SUPPLY LIST

It is not necessary to buy the same brands. Costs may vary with brand, particular item and vendor. If budget is a concern, contact Janine Sahn to discuss alternatives.

*Choose either acrylic **OR** oil.*

When working with oil paints at home make sure to have good ventilation. Keep paints and solvents away from children and pets and food. If headache or nausea occurs when you are painting immediately get fresh air.



1. **Support:** Pre-stretched and primed canvas **OR** wood panel or board (*this may need to be primed with gesso (right)*)



2. **Brushes:** assorted sizes of round and flat brushes, small round brush for detail (*Choosing a brush - make sure it keeps its shape and does not shed.*)

3. **Palette knife** (*plastic or metal, no particular shape*)

4. **Screw lid, glass jar** with wire or scrubby in bottom for agitation.
Turpenoid (*odorless turpentine*)

5. **Paper towels**

6. **Storage container**

7. **Oil paints:** (*suggested colors*) cadmium red light/pale, cadmium red medium, alizarin crimson, cadmium yellow light/pale, ultramarine blue, (ph)thalo blue, yellow ochre, burnt sienna, burnt umber, ivory black, titanium white (*large tube*)

8. **Canvas paper pad**

9. **Palette paper pad**

10. **Linseed oil** or other medium

11. **Small metal container** for medium

Other: easel, smock
